We're pet friendly, with a fenced off-leash dog park and doggie treats when your pooch takes you for a walk to the front office!

Centered in the beautiful Okanagan Valley, Holiday Park Resort is surrounded by championship golf courses, award winning wineries, world class ski hills and numerous lakes for fishing and water sports. The Okanagan Rail Trail runs alongside the resort, offering a scenic walk or bike ride along lake shores from Kelowna to Vernon.

HISTORY OF THE LANDMARK BOAT

Have you ever driven by and wondered about that big blue boat on the side of Highway 97 at Commonwealth Road? The Orchard City II was a 70 ton ship running charters and working for sawmills on Okanagan Lake. It sank during a storm in 1948 and remained at the bottom of the lake for 30 years until it was salvaged and restored. Tragically the boat was lost to fire April 1, 2021 and is dearly missed by all who used it as the resort's landmark.
